

Eliyahu Ha'Navi, A Passover Story

Jews believe that **Elijah the Prophet** (known in Hebrew as **Eliyahu Hanavi**) is perhaps the most beloved prophet in the **Bible**. His lifetime is chronicled in Kings I and King II—including the miracles he performed, the inspiration he caused, and his dramatic ascent to heaven.

According to tradition, Elijah frequently comes down to earth to help Jews in distress or reveal secrets of the Torah to our great scholars. He is present at a Jewish baby boy's circumcision and he visits us every year at the Passover Seder.

Students of the bible understand “The spirit, power, and calling of Elijah is, that ye have power to hold the key of the revelation, ordinances, oracles, powers and endowments of the fullness of the Melchizedek Priesthood and of the kingdom of Yahweh on the earth; and to receive, obtain, and perform all the ordinances belonging to the kingdom of **Yahweh**, even unto the turning of the hearts of the fathers unto the children, and the hearts of the children unto the fathers, even those who are in heaven.” “Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has risen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet even the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. **Matthew 11:11**

1 Corinthians 2:3-5 And I was with you in weakness, and in fear, and in much trembling. And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of **Yahweh**.

The Transfiguration Matthew 17: 1-13

1And after six days Yahushua took with him Peter and James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. 2And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light. 3And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. 4And Peter said to Yahushua, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." 5He was still speaking when, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son, a with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." 6When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces and were terrified. 7But Yahushua came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and have no fear." 8And when they lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Yahushua only.

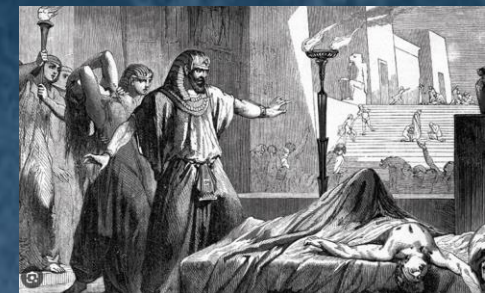
9And as they were coming down the mountain, Yahushua commanded them, "Tell no one the vision, until the Son of Man is raised from the dead." 10And the disciples asked him, "Then why do the scribes say that first Elijah must come?" 11He answered, "Elijah does come, and he will restore all things. 12But I tell you that Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him, but did to him whatever they pleased. So also the Son of Man will certainly suffer at their hands." 13Then the disciples understood that he was speaking to them of John the Baptist.

Now the Lord kills the firstborn sons of the Egyptians (Exodus 11-12). Pharaoh will now let Israel go. He will later loose his army to death in the Red Sea (Exodus 14:4-31).</p>	



The feast of Passover is all about Yahweh's covenant faithfulness to Israel, the same covenant faithfulness that we as Gentiles (returning house of Israel) have been “grafted into” (Rom 11:17-18). If Yahweh has kept His promises and remained faithful to Israel, **He will also remain faithful to us.**

35 Who shall separate us from the love of Mashiach? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

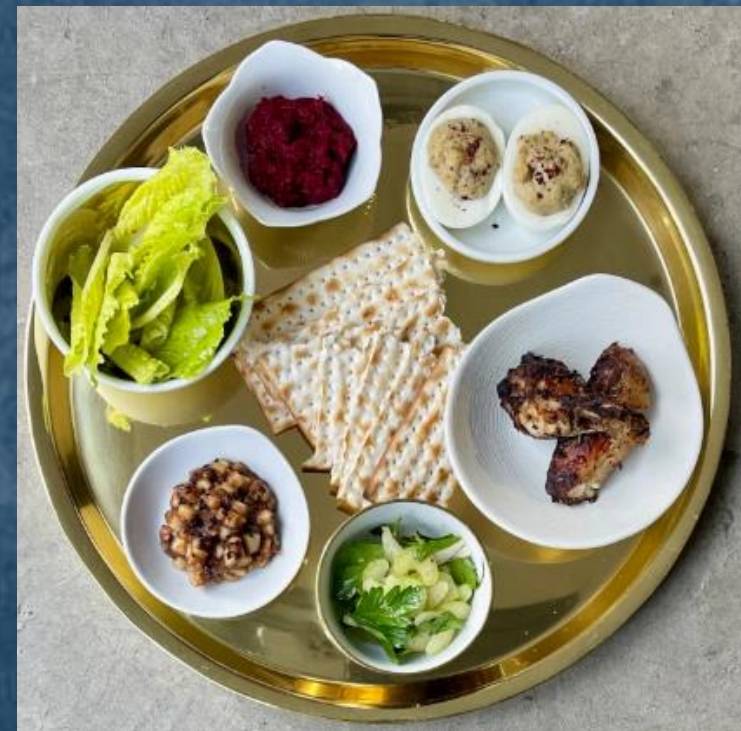
36 As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.

The most important symbols of Passover are the matzah (unleavened bread), maror (bitter herbs), and lamb or shank bone. The Bible tells us that we are to eat the lamb with matzah and maror (Exodus 12:8), and later on the rabbis insisted that we had not properly observed Passover if we did not explain these three items.

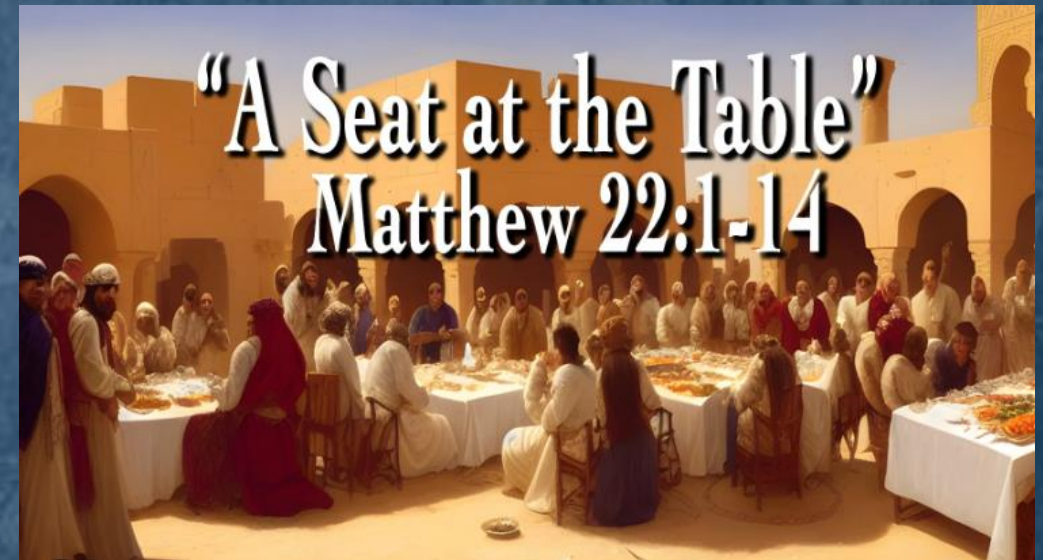
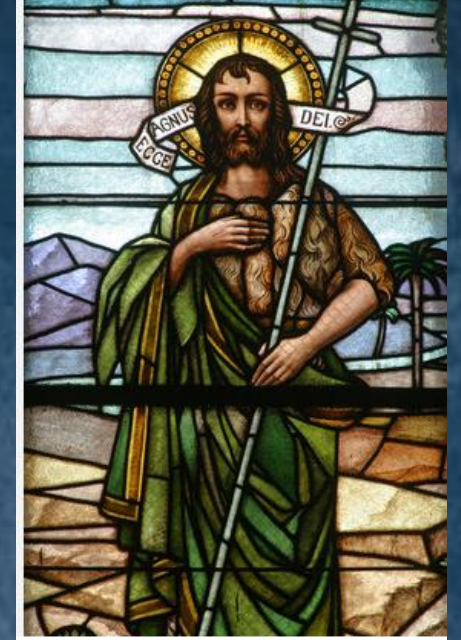
